Autumn

Mental health

Students consider the challenges they are facing, how to reframe negative thinking, how to recognise mental ill-health and when to get help and evaluate strategies to promote emotional well-being.

Work Experience

Students receive the information and tools to identify and contact possible Work Experience opportunities. They will assess their skills and achievements to produce a CV.

Healthy Relationships

Students will learn about relationships focussing on personal values, assertive communication (including in relation to contraception and sexual health), relationship challenges and abuse.

Spring

Exploring influence

Students will learn about the influence and impact of gangs, role models and the media.

British values and Citizenship

Students will learn about Human rights and International law, Diversity through regional, religious and ethnic identities in the UK and the need for mutual respect and understanding.

Students will prepare for Work Experience in terms of health and safety and expectations. They will complete a week's Work Experience placement

Students will evaluate their Work Experience placement.

Students will learn about the impact of financial decisions, debt, gambling and the impact of advertising on financial choices.

Students will learn about the legal system in the UK, different sources of law and how law helps society deal with complex problems.

Mental health

Students will consider their skills and achievements to prepare for their Mock Interview.

Careers Next Steps

Students will prepare for their transition to post 16 education, employment and training through undertaking Careers information, advice and guidance of the opportunities available to them.

Spring

Mock Interview

Students will complete a Mock interview and reflect on their experience.

Volunteering

Students will learn about the different ways in which a citizen can contribute to the improvement of their community, to include the opportunity to participate actively in community volunteering, as well as other forms of responsible activity.

Independence

Students will consider responsible health choices and safety in a range of independent contexts.

Money Matters

Students will learn about financial products in relation to them. These will include credit and debt, insurance, pensions, payslips and tax in a range of relevant contexts including University.

Healthy Relationships

Students will learn about relationships and sex expectations, myths, pleasure and challenges, including the impact of the media and pornography.
