- Please do not fold the A5 into a card shape, leave flat and full sized.

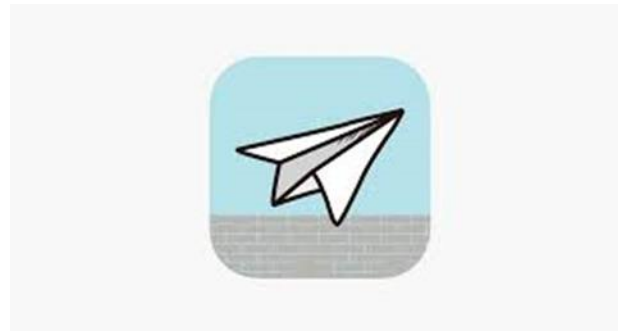

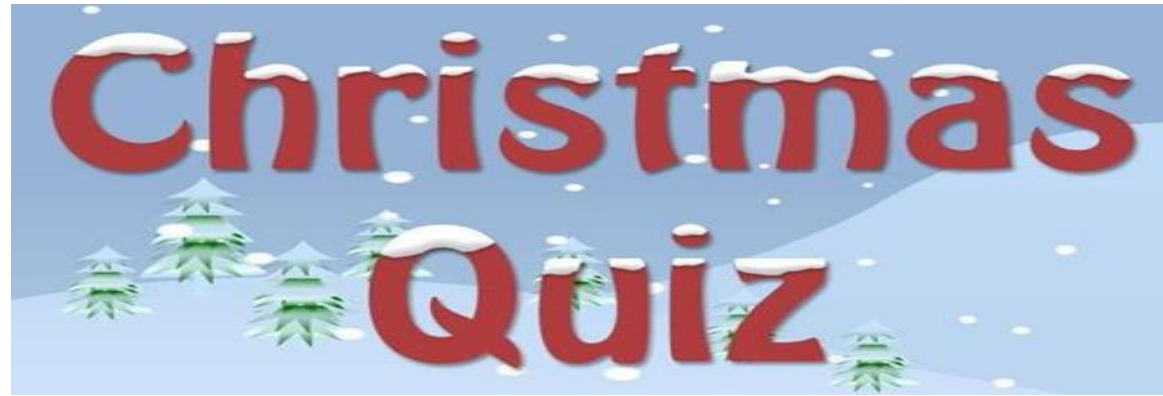
