Happy National Apprenticeship Week!

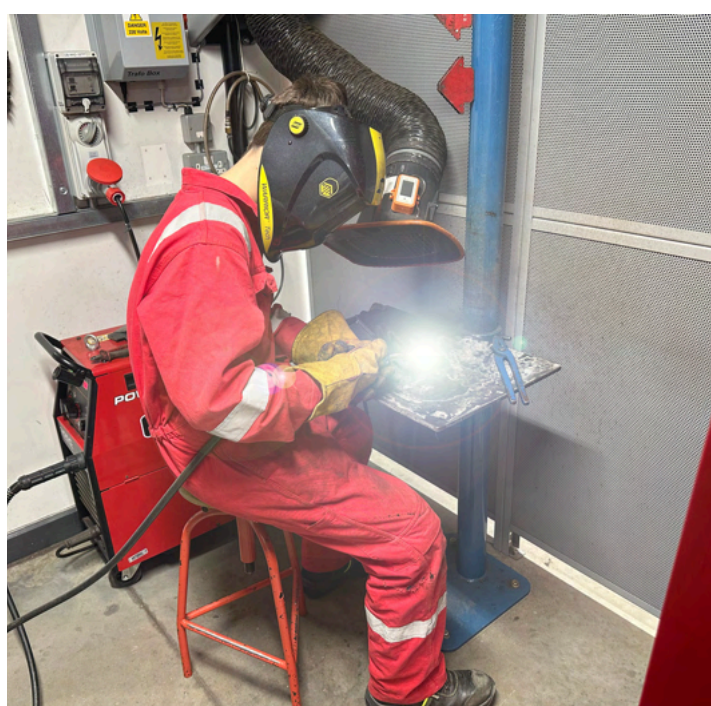
Some of you may already know what course and college you would like to join in September. However, some of you might still be unsure at the moment and that is okay!

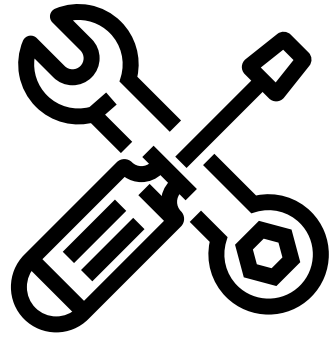
