



Topics to include on a CV

Contact details

- Name
- Phone number & email



Introduction of yourself

- Provide a couple of sentences about you.

Education History

- Name of school and dates attended.
- Qualifications and grades.

Work History

- Any work placements, volunteering or paid jobs you have had.
- Include company names and dates.

Skills/Strengths

- Explain skills you have gained through your work or hobbies.

References

- Contact details of someone that has agreed to give you a reference e.g. current employer or teacher.
