Welcome to Our New Chair of Trustees

Following the annual business meeting I am sharing an update on changes to the Trust board. Our Chair of Trustees Ms Jules Fry MBE is stepping down to Vice Chair following several very successful years in the role of Chair. Jules remains fully committed to the school and will continue in her role of safeguarding Trustee and lead of the Behaviour and Attitudes committee. I would like to personally thank Jules for her support and time over the past couple of years supporting me and the Academy. She has overseen a time of significant school improvement both in academic success and financial investment.

Our new chair of Trustees is Mr Andrew Chapple. Andrew is a highly experienced finance and business professional with a strong academic and professional background; he is currently employed part time as a Senior Consultant for Gregory Distribution Group. Andrew was brought up locally on the family farm at Marwood, attended Braunton School and Community College, followed by A levels at Petroc, and then attained a Degree in Mathematics at University of Southampton where he gained a first class-honours degree.

After graduation Andrew trained and qualified as a Chartered Accountant with KPMG Peat Marwick Mcintosh.
